

#### THE ACADEMIC OFFER

The Faculty's academic offer, available at the Milan, Brescia and Piacenza sites, is divided into three profiles:

- a programme in Sciences of Education and Training Processes (programme class L-19, Sciences of Education and Training Processes) in Milan, Brescia and Piacenza;
- a degree programme in **Sport and Motor Sciences**, inter-faculty with the Faculty of Medicine and Surgery (programme class L-22, Sport and Motor Sciences) in Milan;
- integrated degree programme in **Primary Teacher Education**, qualifying for teaching in kindergarten and primary school as provided for by the regulations by current legislation (programme class LM-85 bis, Primary Teacher Education) in Milan, Brescia and Piacenza.

After graduation, it is possible to continue your studies at Università Cattolica, choosing one of the graduate degree programmes active in Milan, Brescia and Piacenza:

- Educational Counselling for Disability and Marginality (class LM-50, Planning and management of educational services) in Milan;
- Media Education (class LM-93, Theories and methodologies of E-learning and Media Education) in Milan;
- Pedagogical Sciences and Services to the person (class LM-85, Scienze pedagogiche) in Milan;
- Sciences and Techniques of Preventive and Adapted Motor Activity (Class LM-67, Sciences and Techniques of Preventive and Adapted Motor Activities) in Milan;
- Pedagogical Design and Human Resources Training (class LM-50, Planning and Management of Educational Services) in Brescia;
- Educational Design for Child and Youth Services (class LM-50, Planning and Management of Educational Services) in Piacenza;
- Philosophy (interfaculty Education and Arts and Philosophy, class LM-78, Philosophical Sciences) in Milan.



#### **OPPORTUNITIES**

Studying Education at Università Cattolica means becoming part of a laboratory full of opportunities and experiences which, in addition to constituting important opportunities for personal and cultural growth, make it possible to acquire high-level professional skills and to enter the world of work with profit. In particular, they include:

- apprenticeships to familiarise with the world of work in different areas under the guidance of qualified personnel; workshops
  to perfect one's training not only through traditional lectures but also through reflection on the skills acquired and one's
  own aptitudes;
- seminars and conferences organised by the Faculty, which allow you to keep up to date and meet important personalities from the world of education;
- study programmes abroad, also with a view to the final dissertation, comparing the education and training systems of other countries with the Italian one and thus acquiring skills that are in high demand in the world of work.

#### **ADMISSION CRITERIA**

Admission to the degree programme in **Sciences of Education and Training Processes** takes place in chronological order of application (N.B. For the Milan campus, places on the undergraduate degree programme in Sciences of Education and Training Processes are assigned after passing an entrance exam, in chronological order of place reservation).

Procedures, deadlines and details on admission procedures are published on the website www.unicatt.it.

Admission to the integrated degree programme in **Primary Teacher Education** requires passing an admission test it is staggered. The number of places, date, contents and modalities of the selection test are determined from year to year by decree of the Ministry of Education, University and Research.

Admission to the degree programme in Sport and Motor Sciences requires passing a written test, which consists of a computer-based test of 60 multiple-choice questions to be completed in 60 minutes. This is a test assessing the basic knowledge of general culture, biology, chemistry and motor-sports culture. There are 250 places available.

# SCIENCES OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROCESSES

The profile allows for the acquisition of theoretical and practical knowledge and skills related to the education and training of the person, in line with the provisions of paragraphs 594-601 of Law 205/17 and Decree-Law. 65 of 13 April 2017. During the degree programme you can choose examinations, laboratories and internship experiences aimed at improving your education in one of the areas specific to this degree programme, depending on the field in which you wish to work as a professional, from childcare to adult education. It is a profile suitable for those who want to put themselves in the game, acquiring wide-ranging knowledge and putting passion and motivation into play: elements that allow, once graduated, to pursue careers as professionals, consultants and self-employed workers.

#### THE STRUCTURE OF THE PROGRAMME

The programme has a single curriculum, which can be customised by the student. It is possible, depending on one's aptitudes and interests, to orient one's study profile in relation to different specific fields:

- spersonal services;
- childhood education;
- adult education.

Each student, apart from the specific field he/she chooses to study, will have the possibility to acquire in a curricular form the credits that constitute the specific profile for educators of educational services for children required by the Legislative Decree 65 of 13 April 2017.

The profile includes laboratory training activities to promote planning and operational skills in the educational field, as well as to acquire language and IT skills.

#### PROFESSIONAL OUTLETS

A graduate in Sciences of Education and Training Processes is a professional who, depending on the focus of his or her studies, can work in various fields relating to education, training and personal services. In particular, he/she can become:

- professional socio-pedagogical educator in socioeducational and socio-assistance services, managed in the context of public and by social cooperatives, in accordance with the provisions of Law No. 205/2017 and paragraph 571 of Law 145/2018;
- early childhood education services educator (provided he/she has acquired the specific credits required by the regulations);
- trainer and human resources manager (classroom and online tutor, training planner, evaluator of training processes and projects, junior trainer, human resources selection and development practitioner in services and public administration, companies and organisations, training agencies and consultancies).

## NOTE THEOLOGY COURSES

The study plan provides for the attendance of Theology courses, in order to offer a motivated, reasoned and organic knowledge of the Catholic faith. The programme is delivered over the three years. Classes take place 3 hours per week for 12 weeks, and the course is divided into the following themes:

- I year: Fundamental issues: Christological Faith and Holy Scripture;
- II year: Matters of Theological Anthropology and Ecclesiology;
- III year: Theological Questions of Christian Ethics and Morals.

## STUDY PLANS

The study plans published here may be subject to change; official reference study plans will be presented in the specific Faculty Guide.

#### **CREDITS**

In order to obtain the degree, 180 credits (ECTS) are required: normally about 60 credit per year are acquired by means of assessment tests for both courses and supplementary teaching activities (exercises, laboratories, etc.).

Each course is given a certain number of credits (ECTS), the same for all students, and a grade (expressed in a mark out of 30) which varies according to the level of preparation.

The final examination mark is expressed in a mark out of one hundred and ten.

## Acquisition of credits (ECTS) for access to the profession of childcare educator.

Ministerial Decree 378/2018 claims that the educator of educational services for children must have a degree related to the class **L-19 Sciences of Education and Training Processes** with a training profile that meets the minimum requirements of at least 55 ECTS achieved with training activities (teachings, laboratories, internships) related to certain disciplinary areas and with specific content related to childhood issues (0-3 years).

The study plan for our Faculty's degree programme in **Sciences of Education and Training Processes** allows each student to acquire, over the course of three years, the 55 ECTS required by ministerial provisions, irrespective of the specific form that he/she intends to give to his/her study plan, provided that he/she respects certain indications regarding the choice of optional subjects. The forthcoming Faculty Guide will provide all the necessary information in this regard.

THE CORNERSTONE OF THE PROPOSED ITINERARY IS REPRESENTED BY THE APPRENTICESHIP, WHICH IS CONSIDERED AN ESSENTIAL ELEMENT TO COMBINE KNOWLEDGE AND ACTION, AND TO VERIFY THE METHODS IN CLOSE RELATION TO EACH OTHER. IT ALSO ALLOWS TO COME INTO CONTACT WITH ORGANISATIONS THAT CAN OFFER VALUABLE INDICATIONS FOR FUTURE PROFESSIONAL PLACEMENT.

b) carry out 250 hours of training, including 50 hours of indirect training, 200 hours in childcare services. In this case the student acquires 10 curricular ECTS;

c) carry out 250 hours of training, including 50 hours of indirect training, 200 hours in personal services or training contexts. In this case the student acquires 10 curricular ECTS, but does not acquire the necessary credits to be able to work in childcare services (0-3 years).

Teaching-integrative activities (placements and workshops) require compulsory attendance according to a timetable that will be provided at the beginning of each academic year.

(\*) Students can acquire the 15 ECTS by dividing them, indifferently in the second/ third year, between one annual and one semester course or among three semester courses.

In order to acquire the ECTS envisaged for free-choice activities, the Faculty draws students' attention to the following additional courses, in addition to those already envisaged in the general plan of the degree programme and without precluding the possibility of different options that are always consistent with their course of study, aimed at broadening their cultural training and developing specific skills:

Contemporary Art and Artistic Heritage Education, 5 ECTS, Aesthetics, 5 ECTS, Animation Theatre, 5 ECTS, Cross-Cultural Social Psychology, 5 ECTS, Clinical Psychology, 5 ECTS, Psychology of Religion, 5 ECTS.

Students who intend to build a profile aimed at education in early childhood services, in order to obtain the 55 specific ECTS required by the regulations, must include *Clinical Psychology* in their study plan.

The Faculty also draws the attention of students to the educational importance of courses in the field of aesthetic-artistic-theatre education.

The Faculty also points out that the choice may not involve subjects from graduate degree programmes, even if they are supernumerary, with the exception of the subjects from the first three years of the Integrated Degree programme in Primary Teacher Education that do not include laboratory activities and do not repeat the contents of subjects already taught by the student.

The didactic-integrative activities (internships and workshops) require compulsory attendance according to a timetable that will be provided at the beginning of each academic year.

(5) Among the courses already envisaged as optional, as an alternative to each other, in the above-mentioned study plan, the Faculty points out in particular that the teaching of Elements of Family and Juvenile Law is particularly significant for the preparation of some professional profiles envisaged by the degree programme.

(\*) Students can acquire the 15 ECTS by dividing them up, indifferently in the second/third year, between one annual and one semester course or among three semester courses.

In order to acquire the ECTS envisaged for free-choice activities, the Faculty draws the attention of students to the following additional courses, in addition to the courses already envisaged in the general plan of the degree programme, and without precluding the possibility of different options that are always consistent with their course of study, aimed at broadening their education and the development of specific skills: General Psychology, 5 ECTS, Clinical Psychology, 5 ECTS.


These recommended courses are necessary for students who intend to build a profile aimed at education in early childhood services, in order to comply with the 55 ECTS required by the regulations.

The Faculty would also point out that the choice cannot concern courses of the graduate degree programmes, even if they are supernumerary, except for the courses of the first three years of the undergraduate degree programme in Primary Teacher Education which do not include laboratory activities and do not iterate on the content of the courses already taught by the student.

Among the courses already envisaged as optional, as an alternative to each other, in the above-mentioned study plan, the Faculty would like to point out that the courses Elements of Civil and Criminal Law of the Family and Minors and Adolescent Psychology: Risk and Addiction are particularly significant for preparing for certain professional profiles envisaged by the degree programme.

The Faculty also points out that the student's choice may not involve courses of the graduate degree programmes, even if they are supernumerary.

## PRIMARY TEACHER EDUCATION

The Integrated Degree programme in **Primary Teacher Education** qualifies students to teach, i.e. once they have completed their programme, they can be included in the school rankings and take part in ordinary competitions for kindergartens and primary schools. For this reason, it is a demanding course, structured on a very solid knowledge base, which is essentially divided into two areas: the **area of professional knowledge**, socio-psycho-pedagogical disciplines and relational and communication skills; the **area of disciplinary contents** Italian language, foreign language, mathematics, history, geography - which are essential in the training of a future teacher. Teachers trained in this way are increasingly needed in today's schools: they are passionate, competent and capable of designing a coherent educational and didactic profile, able to manage relational dynamics in a context, such as the current one, of growing social complexity and to use the new technologies in a conscious and effective way.

#### THE STRUCTURE OF THE PROGRAMME

The course (o "programme"?) consists of five years, during which a lot of space is devoted to workshops and internships. While the workshops consist of analysis, design and simulation courses, present albeit in different ways in all years, the internship experience.

The internship experience starts in the second year and is continued and progressively expanded until the fifth year, amounting to a total of 600 hours.

#### JOB OPPORTUNITIES

A programme in primary education qualifies you to teach in kindergartens and primary school.

## NOTE THEOLOGY COURSES

The study plan provides for the attendance of Theology courses, in order to offer a motivated, reasoned and organic knowledge of the Catholic faith. The programme is delivered over the three years. Classes take place 3 hours per week for 12 weeks, and the course is divided into the following themes:

- I year: Fundamental issues: Christological Faith and Holy Scripture;
- II year: Matters of Theological Anthropology and Ecclesiology;
- III year: Theological questions of Christian ethics and morals.

During the final two years there is a six-month course of 30 hours in the form of seminars and/or monographs, on a subject related to the curriculum attended, which will conclude with a test set by the professor/lecturer.



## STUDY PLANS

The study plans published here may be subject to change; official reference study plans will be presented in the specific Faculty Guide.

#### **CREDITS**

In order to obtain the integrated degree, 300 credits (ECTS) are required. They are acquired by means of assessment tests for both courses and supplementary teaching activities. Each course is given a certain number of credits (ECTS), the same for all students, and a grade (expressed in a mark out of 30) which varies according to the level of preparation.

#### **FINAL EXAMINATION**

The final examination consists of the discussion of the dissertation and the internship report. The overall assessment is expressed in a mark out of one hundred and ten.

#### **REGISTRATION**

Registration is enrolment in the first year of university. With it you receive a registration number, which is required when registering for examinations and using the services of the university. The Italian term is *immatricolazione*, hence the term *matricola* to describe first-year students.

#### **DEGREE CLASSES**

Course classes, including degree classes (established by Article 4 of the Decree of the Ministry of Universities and Scientific and Technological Research of 3 November 1999, No. 509 and confirmed by Article 4 of Ministry of Education, University and Research Decree No. 270 of 22 October 2004), are groupings of university degree courses of the same level that share certain educational objectives and award degrees with identical legal value. To date, there are 49 degree classes,

97 master's degree classes and 8 single-cycle master's degree classes. With Ministerial Decree no. 446/2020, the Ministry of Universities and Research established three new professionally-oriented degree classes, which provide for the inclusion of at least 48 ECTS credits for workshop and internship activities, aimed at better placing graduates in the world of work. Individual universities may activate one or more degrees in each class, choose their names and decide on their curricula, subject to certain constraints.

All degrees that belong to a class have the same legal value; this is why public competition notices refer to classes and not to degrees.

## **UNIVERSITY TERMINOLOGY**

What does it mean...

#### **ATHENAFUM**

The term 'athenaeum' (ateneo in Italian) derives from the goddess Athena and therefore, by extension, the temple dedicated to her, where rhetoricians and poets recited their poems. Today it is synonymous with university.

#### THREE-YEAR DEGREE

The three-year degree, also known as a first-level degree, is obtained by acquiring 180 ECTS credits over three academic years. It provides the student with an adequate command of general scientific methods and content and guarantees the acquisition of specific professional knowledge. At the end of the course one obtains the title of *dottore*. A secondary school diploma is required for admission onto three-year degree courses.

#### **ECTS CREDITS**

ECTS credits are a method used in universities to measure the quantity of learning required of a student. Each university examination is associated with a certain number of ECTS credits, which are intended to reflect the amount of effort required; traditionally, 1 ECTS credits is equal to 25 hours of work (either personal study or attendance in workshops or lectures). Each course is assigned a certain number of credits, the same for all students, and a mark (out of 30) that varies according to the level of preparation. ECTS credits may be acquired not only by taking examinations, but also through extra-curricular activities recognised by the Faculty.

#### **FACULTY**

Università Cattolica is divided into Faculties, i.e. organisational structures that comprise one or more degree courses. They have the primary task of organising the academic activities provided for by law, the Statute and the regulations. They cooperate with the departments in organising the research doctorates.

## SINGLE-CYCLE MASTER'S DEGREE

Certain types of degree last five or six years. Specifically, these are degrees in Architecture and Building

Engineering, Conservation and Restoration of Cultural Heritage, Pharmacy and Industrial Pharmacy, Law, Veterinary Medicine, Primary Education Sciences (5-year duration), Medicine and Surgery and Dentistry and Dental Prosthetics (6-year duration).

In order to be eligible for the single-cycle master's degree, students require a secondary school diploma.

#### **DEGREE PROGRAMME**

The degree programme is the set of courses, broken down for each year of the course, which the student must attend, taking the relevant examinations, in order to obtain the degree.

#### ACADEMIC YEAR/A.Y.

The academic year begins with the start of classes (end of September-beginning of October) and ends in September of the following year.

#### **LECTURES**

Lectures run from September/October to May/June for YEAR-LONG courses. Courses whose number of hours and duration are equivalent to half of an annual course, are called SEMESTER-LONG courses. The two semesters begin in September/October and/ or February and examinations are held at the end of each semester. SEMESTRALISED courses are courses whose teaching hours are equivalent to an annual course but concentrated in the time frame of a semester course. It still counts as an annual course.

## EXAM DATE AND EXAM SESSION

An exam date is the date on which an examination can be taken. Each faculty decides independently, in accordance with the University's Academic Regulations, how many exam dates to schedule during the year and in which months. The period during which lectures are suspended and examinations can be taken is called a 'session'. Each academic year has three or four examination sessions (depending on the faculty).

#### INTERNSHIP

Internships are educational activities that bring students into contact with the world of work. Some degree courses include a compulsory internship or work experienceperiod within organisations or companies that have an agreement with the university, to be carried out preferably during the final year. Students may also participate in internships and work experience outside the curricular course, both in Italy and abroad.

## DISSERTATION OR FINAL EXAMINATION

This is a written assignment in which the student develops a personal project or research project, usually on a topic related to a subject included in his/her degree programme. It is carried out under the guidance of a lecturer. The overall assessment, which also takes into account the results of individual examinations, is given as a mark out of 110.

#### MASTER'S DEGREE

Master's degrees, also called second-level degrees, last two years (120 ECTS credits) and require students to already have a degree. It provides advanced theoretical and methodological training for performing highly specialist activities in specific fields. At the end of the course, graduates are awarded the title of dottore magistrale.

During the course of study, it is possible to work at the university, to start a paid experience by collaborating with the various structures of the University (libraries, secretariats, offices) for a time equal to 200 hours per year. The call to participate in the selection is published between October and November. In addition, there is the possibility to apply for a fixed-term job (Student Work project), tailored to students, in a way that does not compromise the time to devote to studying and attending courses.

In compliance with the provisions of Law no. 17 of 28 January 1999, which stipulates "individualised treatment for passing university examinations after agreement with the professor/lecturer of the subject [...] the use of specific suitable technical means and the possibility of carrying out equivalent tests on the proposal of the specialised tutoring service' and to the Law of 8 October 2010 no. 170 for which 'students with Specific Learning Disorders are guaranteed, during their education and training at school and university, adequate forms of verification and assessment, also with regard to State examinations and university entrance examinations as well as university examinations', Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore has established the Services for the integration of students with disabilities and with Specific Learning Disorders which, through the technical-administrative and teaching support of specialised pedagogical staff, aim to accompany students in the university experience by supporting them from the early stages of orientation to graduation and the first steps into the world of work.

THE TUITION FEE IS DETERMINED ON THE BASIS OF FAMILY INCOME. EVERY YEAR, APPROXIMATELY 3,000 STUDENTS, BASED ON MERIT AND FINANCIAL CONDITIONS, ARE EXEMPT FROM PAYING UNIVERSITY FEES, WHILE 4,000 GAIN ACCESS TO ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL BENEFITS. STUDENTS WITH A CERTIFIED DISABILITY EQUAL TO OR GREATER THAN 66% AND STUDENTS WITH A RECOGNISED DISABILITY PURSUANT TO ART. 3, SUBSECTION 1 OR SUBSECTION 2 OF LAW NO. 104 OF 5 FEBRUARY 1992 ARE ENTITLED TO TOTAL EXEMPTION FROM ENROLMENT FEES AND UNIVERSITY CONTRIBUTIONS, PAYING €100 UPON REGISTRATION IN

Throughout the year, Università Cattolica offers numerous opportunities - both virtual and in-person - for support on your orientation journey and help you think clearly about your choice of future university studies.


